Dec 2021

Recognized the abatement contractor was underperforming

Dec 2021

Schedule impacts discussed with LPS leadership

Sept-Dec 2021

Performance plan in place for current contractor

Jan-Sept 2022

LPS worked diligently to keep school activities moving forward while construction continued

Oct 2023

Allowed existing contracting team to finalize work.
However, did not allow them to do necessary change orders, to complete unfinished items

Nov 2023


Transitioned the teams to complete the project and get to final Certificate of Occupancy
