
What is a Student Board Member (SBM)?

Student serving on a **state**, **local**, **regional**, or **charter** school Board of Education or equivalent who is invited to and actively participates in at least 50% of regular business meetings in their official capacity.


Student board members are the membership of NSBMA

- Take A Seat Campaign: support student leaders and school districts in creating the SBM position locally, or to advance statewide policy on SBMs
 - Draft student board member policy for school districts

SBM Nick Asante passes mental health day policy change in Montgomery County.

NATIONWIDE

Student board members in our network inspired bills across the USA. Today, 13 states have passed a mental health day policy.



IMPACT

The network provided by NSBMA helped over 15 million students across 13 states benefit from mental health day policies.

| District does not currently have a student board member but has an active student government. | One high school student is selected by the superintendent in collaboration with the high school principal to sit on the school board until they graduate from high school. | Student board members are selected by the student council of the high school through an application process. There are multiple student board members with staggered terms. | Student board members are elected. All enrolled middle and high school students in the district are eligible to vote. |



Requirements and Compensation

| Requirements | District does not currently have a student board member but has an active student government. | There is a SBM in the district and there are GPA requirements for the role. | Students must meet eligibility requirements to participate in extracurricular activities in order to be a student board member. | All students enrolled in grades 9-12 are eligible to run for student board member. * |
| Compensation | District does not currently have a student board member but has an active student government. | District has SBMs but they are not compensated for their role. | SBMs are compensated equivalently to adult board members. | SBMs are compensated for their time, energy, and leadership—through a stipend, elective course credit, scholarship, transportation or gas mileage reimbursement, and other forms of tangible support. |

Onboarding, Training, and Support

| Emerging Role for Student Voice | Emerging Representation | Role for Students in Governance Decisions | Elevated Role for Students in Governance Decisions |
|---|--|--|--|
| District does not currently have a student board member but has an active student government. | There is a SBM role in the district. Students connect with each other around transition of role, adult board members are welcoming to students and fill them in when they have questions. Onboarding, training, and support are informal often initiated by the student. | Students have access to professional development opportunities and are invited into conversation with adult board members and district administrators prior to meetings. Onboarding, training, and support norms are not codified in policy. | Students have access to professional development opportunities and the funding to attend them, there is formal training to start the role included in the district policy (equivalent to what adult board members receive). Students have regular check-ins with district administrators before their term and at regular intervals throughout the year, these practices are codified in local policy. |

| District does not currently have a student board member but has an active student government. | There are student government structures in the middle and high schools. There are avenues for students to impact decision-making and connect with decision-makers. | There is an active student council in the middle and high schools and a student advisory council. | District has SBM and an active student advisory council. School leaders regularly engage students' feedback around school decisions and use that feedback to inform next steps. Every school in the district has formal structures for student decision-making and the SBMs regularly connect with each school. |
