

## **Elections Update & Resources**

It's almost time for candidates to turn in their petitions to run for school board! Starting August 6, school districts can publish the Call for Nominations which provides information about available board seats and how prospective candidates can submit petitions. Additionally, school districts may begin to provide nominating petitions to prospective candidates. Completed candidate petitions are due by August 29. After petitions are received, the district must verify that all signatures on the petition are valid.

To help school districts meet this upcoming deadline and ensure they are ready for candidate petitions, review our Sample Candidate Petition, Sample Call for Nominations, Candidate Petition Verification Cheat Sheet, and Election Timeline. The Candidate Petition is available in English and Spanish and has a 40-signature and a 70-signature version, since signature requirements differ by the size of the district. Our Call for Nominations is also available on Spanish. Alternate versions are available here.
